Our school is situated in the heart of Leeds 9 and we are an exciting, welcoming and diverse school that aims to provide our children with a high quality education.



Ebor Gardens is a school in which every individual child is welcomed and supported to achieve their personal best. We aim to help children to work to become independent young people who are motivated to learn. Our core business is to ensure that pupils achieve. We believe that if we nurture children who enjoy learning, we know that they will make fantastic progress and achieve. Our expectations of behaviour in school are high. The behaviour policy focuses on a restorative approach to challenging behaviours and we understand behaviour as a form of communication.

Through high support and high challenge, we create a culture of reflection and repair based on the principles of restorative practice. This allows children to understand cause and effect, develop empathy towards others and intrinsically make good choices. We have high expectations of behaviour and support each child to meet our expectations.

Our children learn what it means to be a good citizen through our daily endeavours, where a culture of kindness, compassion and empathy enables everyone to thrive.







The School Day

Breakfast Club opens at 7:30am each morning. This is free of charge and is offered to all children from Reception to Year 6.

We work in partnership with Magic Breakfast to enable us to offer free breakfast to all of our pupils, who can settle in and enjoy a range of cereals, a hot, buttered bagel or toast each morning. As well as having the opportunity to eat a good breakfast, children have the chance to meet up with friends, play games and complete fun activities before the school day begins. Breakfast Club is very popular and is one way of giving our children a great start to their day.

Classrooms open at 8:30am and we encourage all children to arrive at this time, although the school day officially starts at 8:45am. This morning welcome session provides a fantastic start for all children, as it enables them to meet and greet their teachers and friends informally before lessons begin at 8:45am.

Teachers make great use of our extensive IT during this 'early bird' session so that all children have the opportunity to get ahead with their learning for the day ahead, revisit yesterday's learning where that is beneficial or just use the time to improve on their rapid recall of the basics such as Times Tables through games.

Pupils arriving after 8:45am will be marked as late and - however, most importantly - will miss important learning, so please help your child achieve by getting them into school on time every day. Should your child's late arrival become consistent, we will work with you to understand the problem and improve this.

The formal school day ends at 3:15pm and all pupils from Reception to Y4 must be picked up by a designated adult. Children in Y5 and Y6 are permitted to walk home independently where we have been given your prior written consent to do so.

We offer a wide range of after-school clubs each year and will publish a full list each term. These clubs are run by school based staff and are great fun for the children. These include activities such as computing, outdoor sports, textiles, Karate, art work, music and much, much more. Children love this time to mix with children outside of their class and to work with adults who are not their class teachers and they form an important part of the magical school experience we are aiming for.

Foundation Stage - Nursery and Reception

In Early Years, we celebrate the uniqueness of each child. We recognise that they all learn and develop in different ways and at different rates and because of this, we tailor the learning of each child to their needs whilst remaining very focused on the skills and experiences which all children need in their first years at school.

We are proud to play our part in helping children grow into confident and independent learners. We know that children develop rapidly with the right amount of risk and challenge and that the environment we have provides this, as well as supporting the development of critical thinking, resilience and perseverance.

We recognise that the environment plays a significant role in supporting children's learning and development and so our indoor and outdoor spaces are designed so that children want to come and play! Through this, your child will develop their knowledge and skills across a broad EYFS curriculum - even though they may tell you they've just been playing!

Our youngest pupils join us the term after their third birthday, beginning Nursery in either September, January or April each year. You can access either 15 hours of free Nursery provision for your child, or take advantage of our free 30 hour provision if you are eligible. Please speak to us as soon as you are thinking about your child beginning with us so that we can help you with the application process.

Your 15 hours of Nursery provision can be taken each morning (8:30am-11:30am) or each afternoon (12:15pm-3:15pm). If you are able to access 30 hours, your child will stay with us for lunch as well as enjoying both morning and afternoon sessions - so will be with us between 8:30am and 3:15pm each day.


Your child begins their formal education full time in Reception in the September following their fourth birthday. Again, the Reception day is from 8:45am until 3:15pm each day.

Your child starting 'big school' is a huge occasion and one which we are delighted to share with you!



Foundation Stage - Nursery and Reception

We believe that every child is capable of achieving and our team is dedicated to ensuring that each child achieves academic success.



We know that a child who thinks they can is much more likely to give it a go, whatever the learning task may be. Children leave Foundation Stage at Ebor Gardens with a fantastic attitude to learning and great confidence in their own ability.

Learning is a partnership that we would love you to be a part of. We recognise that a child's learning journey doesn't begin and end at school; that's why we use Tapestry. This is a secure online Learning Journal that allows



parents to see the progress that their child is making in school. This software records photos, observations and comments which help to create a portfolio of your child's learning while they are with us.

You will love seeing your child's photos as they discover new learning for the first time and be amazed by how much your child achieves in their first few years with us.

We believe that, by working together, we can provide the opportunities for your children to reach for the stars and we know that we will all enjoy every minute of their journey there!



The Curriculum

Over many years, we have created a robust and exciting curriculum with proven results.

This child-focused learning journey takes the children in Ebor Gardens through 'spirals', giving children the chance to revisit and build on their previous knowledge and experiences until they become experts.

Reading, Writing, Maths, Handwriting and Phonics are at the core of what we do at Ebor Gardens.



Our rigorous focus on the core curriculum ensures that each child is able to enjoy success in their learning, regardless of their starting point. Each teacher is equipped with in-depth knowledge of the curriculum and will do whatever it takes to ensure your child succeeds

In our wider curriculum, we teach all National Curriculum subjects and have carefully scaffolded progression in each subject area to enable children to acquire the skills and knowledge they need to pursue these subjects in greater depth when they move on to secondary school. We believe that children learn best when they are excited about a subject and have worked with many experts over the years to develop a bespoke curriculum journey in each subject. Our curriculum offers children the opportunity to develop IT skills fit for the 21st century, to find out about the work of artists and exhibit



their own artwork, to compete in sporting competitions, to find out about the world around them through fieldwork, to learn to play an instrument and to perform as part of a musical ensemble, to create quality products to be sold through enterprise projects, to share their learning through verbal presentations to an audience and to pursue historical concepts through drama.

Our after school clubs and our strong commitment to providing opportunities for trips, visitors and experiences all further enhance the learning experience for your child.

This rich curriculum is a source of great pride and one which we cannot wait to share with you and your child. Throughout your child's primary years, prepare to be amazed by their rich journey in learning with us.

English as an Additional Language

We are a multilingual school and proud of our plurilingual pupils. We believe that knowing more than one language gives pupils a significant advantage in life, so we expect very high levels of achievement from our pupils.



Pupils with English as an Additional Language are the overwhelming majority of our pupils and they are a very diverse group, as the School Census advice says:

A first language other than English should be recorded where a child was exposed to the language during early development and continues to be exposed to this language in the home or in the community. If a child was exposed to more than one language (which may include English) during early development the language other than English should be recorded, irrespective of the child's proficiency in English.

Approximately 50 languages are spoken by pupils at our school. Some pupils come from homes where at least two languages other than English are spoken. Some pupils can read and write well in another language while others have little literacy in any language. The proficiency levels are regularly reviewed using our assessment documents, which link detailed level descriptors to teaching and learning strategies.

Teaching and Learning

All of our teachers are EAL teachers, involved in everything from the induction of new arrivals to the teaching of the higher order English language skills necessary for higher than expected outcomes in national tests.

In order to support our staff we give them access to high quality professional development which exemplifies the practical strategies in our assessment documents.



Child **Rewards**

We believe in creating children who find joy and motivation in succeeding and making the right choices. We nurture this through praise and positive feedback that is specific and sincere.

Adults in our school are always on the lookout for positive behaviour and enjoy rewarding this, whether through praise or Dojo points - our school reward system. Children at Ebor Gardens love acquiring Dojo points, which can be exchanged for a range of prizes in our Dojo shop.



Our Dojo Shop is an exciting place for any child. Here the children get to trade in the points they have earnt through the week for prizes or - if they choose to - they can save their points for something bigger! This shop gets restocked regularly and we love taking suggestions from our children about what to put in next. Prizes range from small (bouncy balls, stationery and puzzles) to large (scooters, footballs and craft kits) and we can guarantee there is something for everyone in this very special place!

Throughout the week, we make spotting and recognising brilliant learning our job and we are always amazed by the learning our children can achieve! Pupils are encouraged to share their achievements with the Principal and are actively encouraged to visit and share the things of which they are proud.

A wide range of further rewards are also used to promote positive behaviours.

Each week, we also have a celebration assembly where children are recognised for their outstanding achievements that week through a further range of certificates and awards

Parents are encouraged to come along to our celebration and enjoy seeing their children receive their awards.



School Meals

We believe that eating in school should be a pleasurable experience and recognise that time spent sharing good food with their peers is one of the most enjoyable aspects of every child's day!



Each day, we offer a meal service where children can choose from multiple options: a traditional dinner, a vegetarian option, a halal option or a jacket potato with a range of fillings.

We work closely with our school meal provider to ensure that our menu meets the ambitions of the DfE School Food Standards. These School Food Standards are intended to help children develop healthy eating habits and ensure that they get the energy and nutrition they need across the whole school day. Full details of the delicious menu on offer is available on the school website and - whilst children can bring a packed lunch from home if you prefer - all children are strongly encouraged to take a hot school dinner.

All pupils in the UK are offered a free school meal throughout Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. In addition, children whose parents are eligible for Income Support are entitled to free school meals in Years 3-6.

Payment for meals taken for those not eligible for Free School Meals in Years 3-6 is a very simple online system, so that the process is easy to access for all and meals can be taken on an ad-hoc basis.

During lunchtimes, our values are the same as within the classroom - respectful, honest, safe and responsible. We pride ourselves on good manners and positive behaviour during lunch service and children are well supported by a team who provide a caring and supportive environment. We invest heavily in playground equipment so that lunch times really are enjoyable, safe and fun for everyone.

Meeting our Children's Needs

Ebor Gardens is an academy that is welcoming, caring and safe. We are fully committed to developing warm and positive relationships with our young people and believe that every child is capable of brilliant things. We create individual pathways for our children which are built around their varied needs and support them to achieve positive outcomes.

It is every staff member's priority to truly make a difference to the lives of each and every child here at Ebor Gardens. A part of the Wellspring Academy Trust, we pride ourselves on our exceptional inclusive practice and are absolutely dedicated to achieving the best for each and every young person in our care.

To ensure that your child receives the best possible support whilst in school, we have built strong relationships with outside agencies.

These include:

Speech and Language Therapists, who work with us to support a child's speech, language and communication needs

Occupational Therapists, who work with us to support a child's sensory and physical needs.

Educational Psychologists, who work with us

to assess and support children who may be experiencing difficulties in their learning.

STARS, who work with us to support children with autism.

NHS medical Practitioners, including paediatricians and school nurses, who work with us to support a wide range of medical needs.

Thrive Practitioners, who work with us to assess and support children who may be experiencing social and emotional difficulties. Our Thrive Approach helps every child to feel happy and secure, able to enjoy friendships and to be ready and able to learn.

Should your child need support in any of these or other areas, we will be with you each step of the way. Our exceptional SENDCO

works closely with all staff and this wide range of outside agencies to create the right learning conditions for every child.

Our SENDCO works in close partnership with our partner schools and has a fantastic knowledge of the needs of all our children, ensuring each and every one can thrive during their time with us. Starting School in Nursery

Once you have secured a place in our Nursery, we will work with you to ensure your child makes a fantastic start with us.



We will begin with home visits to meet you and your child in their own setting, where they are often much happier to talk to their visiting teacher and ask them questions about school - and whatever they would like to find out about! These visits will also provide you with key information and allow you to tell us about your child, as well as asking any questions that you may have.

Before they start with us, we will organise some stay and play sessions so that you and your child can visit Nursery together and explore the indoor and outdoor environments.

This is a really important part of the settling process as it allows you to keep talking with your child about the Nursery, the people and the exciting things they will be able to do there.

We like to phase our Nursery new starters in over a number of days, so we will agree a start date with you on our visit.



We encourage children to stay for the full session once they begin with us, but if you would prefer a more gradual entry please talk to us so that we can create a plan which will suit your child.

Starting School in Reception

Once you have secured a place, your child will have the opportunity to meet their new teacher. Over the Summer term, there will be many opportunities for you and your child to find out more about the school and the adults they will be working with.

If your child hasn't previously been in our Nursery setting, we will begin with home visits prior to starting school. This allows your child to see their new teacher in a setting which is familiar to them. This first 'hello' ensures that, when your child starts, they have a familiar face to go to.

In July, we will organise some transition days in the Reception classrooms where they will have the chance to meet their new friends and adults. Again, if your child has not previously been in our Nursery setting, we will work with you to support your child in this big adventure.

We will also organise an information meeting for all parents to attend so that we can tell you more about your child's journey into Reception, and also so that you can ask us those allimportant questions about things that matter to you.


