### Birthday Cakes in School—Natasha's Law

We can not allow birthday cakes in school.

Due to Natasha's Law (October 2021), we must be aware of all ingredients and allergens in any food given to our children in school. We also have children and staff in school with nut allergies. If you wish to send treats in for your child's birthday, they must be in sealed packages (perhaps sweets) with all ingredients listed on the packaging. The children can then take them home so parents can check. Please check with your child's class teacher or the admin team if you are not sure.



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


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
