What are we learning this half term?

This half term, in Maths we will be focusing on Algebra, Statistics and Fractions, Decimals and Percentages. Children in Year 6 will also be revising a range of areas in preparation for SATs.

In reading this half term, the Year 5 children will be reading 'Pax' and in Year 6 they will be reading 'Friend or Foe'. We will use these texts to help us develop key reading skills, such as retrieval, inference, deduction, vocabulary, summarizing and sequencing.

In our writing this half term, we are writing a mixed genres for a range of audience and purposes. We will be focusing on vocabulary choices as well as complex punctuation, abstract and plural nouns and comparative and superlative adjectives.

Year 6 will also be working hard throughout the half term with additional SATs practice.

P.E

In P.E this half term, we will be working on orienteering, Sports Day events and athletics. Children will also continue sessions with Junior Jam. On a Wednesday, please ensure your child comes to school in their full P.E kit, which is a white t-shirt, black shorts, black jogging bottoms/leggings, pumps or trainers.
