### Group A streptococcus: tonsillitis, scarlet fever and impetigo

As is typical for this time of year, we currently have a few cases of the above illnesses in our children, across especially our younger year groups. Understandably, if you are following the news at the moment, many parents are concerned about their child's health where serious illness and even death are being attributed to Group A streptococcus (Strep A). Group A streptococcus (GAS), is a common bacteria which causes a number of infections common in children – including tonsillitis, scarlet fever and impetigo. As we all know, children typically get well from these infections within days of falling ill, but in rare cases the infection can become more serious. We obviously want to ensure everyone is safe and well, so are asking parents to follow the guidance below:

If your child is unwell with symptoms associated with Strep A (high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands) please keep them at home until they are well

Seek medical advice from your GP, in case your child needs antibiotics to recover

Tell us if your child has been confirmed as a Group A streptococcus infection, so that we can report any rise in cases to the Local Health Protection Team.

# TIKTOK



TikTok is a free social media platform that lets users create, share and watch short videos ranging anywhere from 15 seconds to 10 minutes in duration. The app gained notoriety for its viral dances, trends and calebrity comeos and can be a creative, fun platform for teems to enjoy. Now available in 75 languages, it has more than a billion active users worldwide (as of spring 2022) and is most popular with the under 16 agg bracket. In fact, a 2022 Occam report found TikTok to be the most-used social media platform features are content, particularly among young people aged 12 to 17.

# Advice for Parents & Carers

#### **ENABLE FAMILY PAIRING**

Family Pairing allows parents to link their TikTek account with their child's and control their settings remotely. Parents can then, for example, turn on Restricted Mode (reducing the chances of a child seeing inappropriate content); set acreen time limits; and manage their child's ability to send messages (and to whom). Children con't after these settings without parental approval.

#### MAKE ACCOUNTS PRIVATE

Although under-18s will have their TikTok account set to private by default, bypossing this setting is relatively easy. Nowever, parents have the ability to manually set their chief's account to private - meaning that their videas won't be visible to strangers and they wan't be able to exchange messages with people who aren't an their related is.

#### LIMIT IN-APP SPENDING

If your child is using an iffhone or Android device to access TikTak, you can other the settings to prevent them from making in roop purchases.
