

What are we learning this half term?

This half term, in Maths we will be focusing on Measures: learning specifically about length, weight and capacity. We will also be looking at Perimeter & Area .

In reading this half term, we will be reading Michael Morpurgo's 'Kensuke's Kingdom'. We will use this text to help us develop key skills, such as retrieval, inference, deduction, summarizing and sequencing.

In our writing this half term, we are writing short writes, including Narnia, Maleficent and Tuesday. We will be focusing on vocabulary choices as well as conjunctions, phrases and clauses.

Year 6 will also be working hard throughout the half term with additional SATs practice throughout the term,

6NP Wednesday

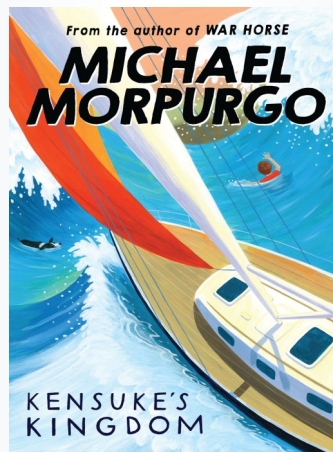

Our Geography topic will be looking at **Geography - Regions of the Americas: The Amazon Rainforest**, we will be using our knowledge of climate and biomes to research this area, making similarities and differences.

In Science we will be focusing on the topic on **LIGHT** where children will recognise that light appears to travel in straight line and explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye.

Homework, Home Reading and Spellings

As always Reading is a key focus area both in school and at home and we will ensure that children continue to bring a suitable book home daily to read. Please ensure your child reads at home each night and returns a completed journal each day.

Every Friday children will receive a reading and Maths homework to be returned the following Wednesday.
